NEW TESTAMENT READING

I CORINTHIANS 6:9-11, 15-20

Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, 10 nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. 11 And such were some of you. PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATES

Session: On behalf of All Saints Presbyterian Church, we present David Howell

and John Wages to be ordained deacons in Christ's holy catholic Church.

Minister: Have they been selected in accordance with the standards of this Church

and do you believe their manner of life to be suitable to the exercise of

this ministry?

Session: We certify that they have satisfied the requirements of the standards and

we believe them to be qualified for this office.

EXPLANATION OF THE OFFICE OF DEACON AND CHARGE TO THE CANDIDATE

My brothers, every Christian is called to follow Jesus Christ, serving God the Father, through the power of the Holy Spirit. God now calls you to a special ministry of servanthood directly under your elders. In the name of Jesus Christ, you are to serve all people, particularly the poor, the weak, the sick, and the lonely.

As a deacon in the Church, you are to study the Holy Scriptures, to seek nourishment from them, and to model your life upon them. You are to make Christ and his redemptive love known, by your word and example, to those among whom you live, and work, and worship. And you are to interpret to the Church the needs, concerns, and hopes of the world.

It is also your duty as a deacon to develop the grace of liberality in the members of the church, to devise effective methods of collecting the gifts of the people, and to distribute these gifts according to the purposes for which they are contributed. At all times, your life and teaching are to show Christ's people that in serving the helpless they are serving Christ himself.



QUESTIONS TO THE DEACON CANDIDATES

Minister: My brothers, do you believe that you are truly called by God and his

Church to the office of deacon?

Candidates: I believe I am so called.

Minister: Do you now in the presence of the Church commit yourself to this

trust and responsibility?

Candidates: I do.

Minister: Do you believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments,

as originally given, to be the inerrant Word of God,

the only infallible rule of faith and practice?

Candidates: I do.

Minister: Do you sincerely receive and adopt the Confession of Faith and the

Catechisms of this Church, as containing the system of doctrine taught in the Holy Scriptures; and do you further promise that if at any time you find yourself out of accord with any of the fundamentals of this system of doctrine, you will, on your own initiative, make known to your Session the change which has taken place in your views since the assumption of this ordination vow?

Candidates: I do and will.

Minister: Do you approve of the form of government and discipline

of the Presbyterian Church in America, in conformity with the

general principles of biblical polity?

Candidates: I do.

Minister: Do you accept the office of deacon in this church, and promise

faithfully to perform all the duties thereof, and to endeavor by the

grace of God to adorn the profession of the Gospel in your

life, and to set a worthy example before the Church of which God

has made you an officer?

Candidates: I do.

Minister: Do you promise subjection to your brethren in the Lord?

Candidates: I do.



Minister: Do you promise to strive for the purity, peace, unity and edification

of the Church?

Candidates: I do.

Minister: Will you be faithful in prayer, and in the reading and study of the

Holy Scriptures?

Candidates: I will.

Minister: Will you look for Christ in all others, being ready to help and serve

those in need?

Candidates: I will.

Minister: Will you do your best to pattern your life and that of your family in

accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a

wholesome example to all people?

Candidates: I will.

Minister: May the Lord who has given you the will to do these things give you

the grace and power to perform them.

Candidates: Amen.

QUESTION TO THE CONGREGATION

Minister: Do you, the members of All Saints Presbyterian Church, acknowledge

and receive these brothers as deacons, and do you promise to yield them all that honor, encouragement and obedience in the Lord to which this office, according to the Word of God and the Constitution of this

Church, entitles them?

People: We do.

Minister: May the Lord by his grace uphold you in the service he lays upon you.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.



Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body and our souls washed through his most precious blood that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us.



Celebrant: Gracious God, pour out Your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these Your gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. By Your Spirit make us one with Christ, that we may be one with all who share this feast, united in ministry in every place. As this bread is Christ's body for us, send us out to be the body of Christ in the world.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. Amen.

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:
Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come,
Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread,
and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil, for Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever.


