

NEW TESTAMENT READING

I CORINTHIANS 2:16-3:9, 4:9,11-13, 16

But we have the mind of Christ.

3:1 But I, brothers, could not address you as spiritual people, but as people of the flesh, as infants in Christ. 2 I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for it. And even now you are not yet ready, 3 for you are still of the flesh. For while there is jealousy and strife among you, are you not of the flesh and behaving only in a human way? 4 For when one says, "I follow Paul," and another, "I follow Apollos," are you not being merely human?

5 What then is Apollos? What is Paul? 

By Your Spirit make us one with Christ, that we may be one with all who share this feast, united in ministry in every place. As this bread is Christ's body for us, send us out to be the body of Christ in the world.

The ushers will guide you to the serving lines. The inner circle of each communion tray contains grape juice, the outer circles contain wine. Gluten-free bread is served in the far right section in front of the musicians.




