

#### **OLD TESTAMENT READING**

GENESIS 4:1-10

Now Adam knew Eve his wife, and she conceived and bore Cain, saying, "I have gotten a man with the help of the Lord." 2 And again, she bore his brother Abel. 


#### WE COME TO HIS TABLE






