



Celebrant: We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. 
WE COME TO HIS TABLE

DAILY LECTIONARY READINGS

These readings are provided as a personal, family, or group worship resource. They are set in the Revised Common Lectionary, a schedule of daily Bible reading in accord with the Church year. They are designed around a two-year cycle that will take you through the Old Testament once, the New Testament twice, and the Psalms frequently. We are currently in the "Year I" cycle. Consider using these readings in conjunction with the All Saints Daily Office Booklets.

SUNDAY, THE LORD'S DAY, SECOND SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY
