
SUNDAY WORSHIP



GOSPEL READING

LUKE 7:36-39

One of the Pharisees asked him to eat with him, and he went into the Pharisee's house and reclined at the table. 37 And behold, a woman of the city, who was a sinner, when she learned that he was reclining at table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of ointment, 38 and standing behind him at his feet, weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head and kissed his feet and anointed them with the ointment. 39 Now when the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, for she is a sinner."




Celebrant: The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him by faith, with thanksgiving.

WE COME TO HIS TABLE

All Saints welcomes all baptized Christians who believe in the Gospel (good news) of Jesus Christ to participate in the Eucharist meal. This includes all Christians, whether members at All Saints or another Christian community. Children who have been baptized and interviewed by the elders of this church or the ruling body of another church are also welcome to the table.

The ushers will guide you to the serving lines. The inner circle of each communion tray contains grape juice, the outer circles contain wine. Gluten-free bread is served in the far right section in front of the musicians.


