

NEW TESTAMENT READING

PHILIPPIANS 4:1-9

Therefore, my brothers, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm thus in the Lord, my beloved.

2 I entreat Euodia and I entreat Syntyche to agree in the Lord. 3 Yes, I ask you also, true companion, help these women, who have labored side by side with me in the gospel...

4 Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. 5 Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; 6 do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. 7 And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Minister: Father in heaven, we need to be forgiven.

We have tried hard to pile up good deeds that outweigh our sins. When this doesn't work, we turn quickly to denial and distraction.

Instead of trusting in the resurrection of Jesus Christ, we have tried to change through our own efforts.

We have tried to change our hearts through sheer willpower.

This has left some of us arrogant.

This has left most of us anxious and depressed.

Minister: Forgive us for trying to heal ourselves.

Forgive us for neglecting your grace.

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OLD TESTAMENT READING

JONAH 4:1-11 (TRANSLATION BY PHILLIP CARY)

And it was grievous to Jonah, a great evil, and he was angry. 2 And he prayed to the LORD and said, "Please, LORD! Wasn't this what I said when I was in my own country? That is why I fled to Tarshish before. For I know you are 'a gracious and merciful God, slow to anger and abounding in loving-kindness,' and you 'repent of the evil,' 3 And now, LORD, please take my soul away from me, for it is better for me to die than live." 4 And the LORD said, "Is it good for you to be angry?"

5 Then Jonah went out from the city and sat to the east of the city. There he made himself a booth and sat down under it in the shade until he should see what would become of the city. 6 And the LORD God prepared a gourd and made it come up over Jonah to be a shade upon his head, to deliver him from his evil. And Jonah rejoiced in the gourd with great joy. 7 And God prepared a worm when the morning came up the next day, and it struck the gourd and it withered. 8 And it came to pass that when the sun rose God prepared a strong east wind, and the sun struck Jonah's head and he fainted, and he asked his soul to die and said, "It is better for me to die than live." 9 And God said to Jonah, "Is it good for you to be angry about the gourd?" And he said, "It is good for me to be angry and die." 10 And the LORD said, "You pitied the gourd, for which you did not labor nor did you make it grow great, which was a son of the night and perished as a son of the night; 11 and should I not pity Nineveh, that great city, in which there are more than a hundred twenty thousand human beings who can't tell their right hand from their left – and also abounding in livestock?"

People: Thanks be to God!

and was made man;

and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered and was buried,

and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures,

and ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; and he shall come again, with glory, to judge both the living and the dead;

whose kingdom shall have no end.

And we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of Life,

who proceeds from the Father and the Son;

who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified;

who spoke by the prophets;

and we believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church; we acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins;

and we look for the resurrection of the dead,

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Celebrant: And so, Father, we who have been redeemed by Your only Son, and made a new people by water and the Spirit, now bring before you these gifts.

People: Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ our Lord.

Celebrant: For in the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Remembering now his work of redemption, and offering to you this sacrifice of thanksgiving, we celebrate his death and resurrection, as we await the day of his coming.

People: We do not presume to come to this, Your Table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own

righteousness, but in your manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your Table. But you are the same Lord whose property is always to have mercy. Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean

by his body and our souls washed through his most precious blood that we may

evermore dwell in him, and he in us.

Celebrant: Gracious God, pour out Your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these Your

gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. By Your Spirit make us one with Christ, that we may be one with all who share this feast, united in ministry in every place. As this bread is Christ's body for

us, send us out to be the body of Christ in the world.

People: Amen.

Celebrant: The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance

that Christ died for you, and feed on him by faith, with thanksgiving.

CHILDREN WHO HAVE BEEN BAPTIZED AND INTERVIEWED BY THE ELDERS OF THIS CHURCH OR THE RULING BODY OF ANOTHER CHURCH ARE ALSO WELCOME TO THE TABLE.

The ushers will guide you to the table. The inner circle of each communion tray contains grape juice. Gluten-free communion wafers are available upon request; indicate to your server if you would like the gluten-free option.

If you're still investigating Christianity, not sure what you believe, or simply choose not to participate in the Eucharist, you may either remain in your seat or come forward, cross your arms over your chest, and receive a blessing.
